THE VADA KINMAN OLDFIELD SCHOLARSHIP

FOR WHOM: Any Nebraska high school senior who will graduate.

WHAT: Writing an essay using not over one thousand words with the

subject being "WHY THIS NEBRASKA VETERAN SHOULD

BE RECOGNIZED AND HONORED."

To quality, the Veteran to be written about must have been honorably discharged and been born and raised in Nebraska or

lived the majority of his/her life in Nebraska.

There must be a title sheet with the essay with the student's name

on it; no student's name on the essay.

PROCEDURES: Initial screening of entries to be done by teachers at the school of

origin. The best two entries from each school will be sent to the North Platte Public Library; 120 West 4th Street; North Platte, NE 69101; Attn: VADA KINMAN OLDFIELD SCHOLARSHIP. Entries must be postmarked no later than October 1st in the year

they are to be judged.

JUDGING: Judging will be done by qualified people living in Nebraska and

the decision of the judges will be final.

WINNER/WINNERS: There will be one winner but not over two winners depending on

the decision of the judges.

The winner receives two thousand dollars. If there are two winners,

each will receive one thousand dollars.

The winner/winners will be announced during the Veterans' Day Ceremony in November in their home town, the year prior to their graduation. The award will be presented to the winner/winners at

the school's Honors Day Ceremony or graduation.

The prize money will be sent for tuition to the college of the

student's choosing, after graduation.
