HOW MUCH?

This event is FREE, but registration is required. You will be provided with dinner Friday evening and three meals on Saturday, along with instruction and guidance during the day and half event.

WHAT WILL THIS ENTAIL?

The event will provide instruction on how to work through a one-page Lean Canvas. This will help you:

Ol Identify the problem(s) that you want to solve.

- **O21** Articulate your solution to the problem(s) and what the existing alternatives are.
- OSI Understand your target market and unique value proposition.
- Brainstorm potential challenges in starting up.
- **os**Determine an effective marketing strategy including pricing, promotion and distribution.
- Obtain a realistic picture of your idea's profit potential.

To go through these different areas, there will be short periods of instruction, followed by time to work through activities and get feedback from a variety of business mentors who are entrepreneurs or who are involved in small business development education. At the end of the event, you will have a chance to explain your plan to instructors, mentors, and potential investors. One plan will win a \$1,000 business grant to turn their plan into reality.


Driver Training School is an essential step to learning safe, life-long driving skills. You will learn basic traffic laws, driver awareness, rules of the road, and basic motor vehicle operation. This course consists of 6 hours of classroom time and 6 hours of driving time as required by the Nebraska DMV. This class is only for students who meet the following criteria: (1) Student must be 18 years of age or older, (2) a) failed three successive drive tests from the department so that he or she may not retest for 90 days, or b) has not held a valid driver's license from this or any other U.S. state or jurisdiction within the last five years. Must have learner's permit before class begins.

Driver's Education

Thursdays, February 1 - March 22 & Wednesday, February 21 7 - 9:30 PM

Warren Everts (Driving Instructor) & Mark Frecks (Classroom Instructor), \$250, MC201

Driver's Education is an essential first step to learning safe, life-long driving skills. Driving is one of the first major responsibilities in a teen's life. Driver Education teaches teens basic traffic laws, driver awareness, rules of the road, and basic motor vehicle operation. This course consists of 20 hours of classroom time and 5 hours of driving time as required by the Nebraska DMV. The class prepares drivers for licensure by awarding a Drive Test Waiver upon satisfactory completion. Minimum student age is 14. Students must attend all sessions, have a learner's permit before class begins, and meet all drive requirements in order to obtain the Drive Test Waiver. The Nebraska DMV deserves the right to test anyone at any time. Driving sessions will be separate from class times. A "Triple A" book is required for this class and may be obtained at the college book store.

Kid's Academy: Think Like a Mechanical Engineer: Da Vinci's 15th Century Catapult (Gr 6-12)

Saturdays, Feb 3, 10, 17, 24 9 AM - Noon

Learn introductory mechanical design concepts using Inventor, Autodesk's 3D CAD design software. Inventor is a tool mechanical engineer's use to design ideas, visualize concepts, and simulate how designs will perform in the real world. Students will apply critical-thinking in both self-directed and teAM environments and unlock their creative potential with 3D mechanical design tools. Students will:

- Measure existing parts using scales and calipers
- Create a 3D computer-generated model of the catapult using Autodesk Inventor
- · Assemble and stimulate movement of catapult parts
- Build the catapult kit

Students have access to free 3-year license of Inventor. Computers are available with software in class or students can download software on their own computers.


