# Wauneta-Palisade Mission Statement:

Wauneta-Palisade Public Schools intends to be prepared to meet the health and safety needs of its students and staff during the 2020-21 school year, in light of the COVID-19 pandemic. This framework is structured to allow the district to be responsive to the current health climate and to articulate expectations for students, staff, and parents, amid changing school and community health conditions. The tiered structure of this framework coincides with the "Risk Dial for COVID-19" from the Southwest Nebraska Public Health Department. This framework may be adjusted, as needed, to meet the needs of students, staff, and parents of Wauneta-Palisade Public Schools.

Current Risk Dial Zone: Moderate (Yellow)

If there is a positive case of Covid-19 at Wauneta-Palisade School, SWNPHD will conduct the tracing and assign any quarantine requirements. The school district will not put out any notification, unless required by law and permitted under confidentiality laws.

### D8on & Rationale for Use of Risk Dial Zones:

Southwest Nebraska Public Health Department provides a Covid-19 "Risk Dial" for the geographic area it serves, which informs the public about the activity level of COVID-19 virus in its service area and the area medical services' ability to respond to current demands. This "risk dial" will serve as a barometer for the school's operational response to the virus. The school will use the "risk dial" in conjunction with the school's monitoring of the virus activity within the school to determine which "risk dial operational zone" the school will operate in. The current "risk dial operational zone" will be clearly communicated to students, staff, and parents through the school's website, social media, and through the school's "all call" system, along with specific guidance based on the school's current operational zone. By fostering collaboration between the Southwest Nebraska Public Health Department, the school's nurse, and the school's administration to closely monitor current health conditions relevant to the COVID-19 virus, the administration will be able to assess the safest and most non-restrictive educational environment for students, staff, and parents at Wauneta-Palisade Public School.

# **Return to School Consideration 2020-2021**

State health officials in partnership with the Nebraska Department of Education and the governor's office have developed a color-coded risk dial that will assist local school districts in assessing their current COVID 19 risk levels. The dial will also provide recommended actions aligned to each risk category (green, yellow, orange, and red).

### Green Zone – Low Risk

School is Open Regular School - No Restrictions No Social Distancing Hand Washings

All students and staff should perform "self-screening" before reporting to school each day. If students or staff display any of the following symptoms, they are advised to stay home:

- Flu-like or COVID-like symptoms
- Temperature of 100.4 or greater
- Difficulty breathing
- Sore throat
- Cough

### Yellow Zone – Moderate Risk

All students and staff should perform "self-screening" before reporting to school each day. If students or staff display any of the following symptoms, they are advised to stay home and we encourage contacting your medical provider to determine if testing is needed:

- Flu-like or COVID-like symptoms including but not limited to:
  - o Temperature of 100.4 or greater
  - o Difficulty breathing
  - o Sore throat
  - o Cough

#### **Orange Zone – Significant Risk**

As a school we would move into the orange zone at the direction of the health department if there are increasing numbers of positive tests for COVID 19. At that time the health department will complete contract tracing and inform us of the actions we need to take as a school district. Students will have to quarantine if directed to do so by the health department.
